Since 1979, Burke's Memory Evaluation and Treatment Service (METS) has offered patients and their caregivers a comprehensive program of care—from diagnosis through support services.



A Caregiver's Experience with Burke's Memory Evaluation & Treatment Services Program

When Anita's mother was about 84 years old, Anita began to wonder if the symptoms her mom had been experiencing for a few years—agitation, confusion and forgetfulness—were a sign of something more than simply old age. Thinking that it could be dementia, Anita brought her mother to the METS program at Burke. "The diagnosis was mixed Alzheimer's disease and vascular dementia, still in a mild stage. It was extremely upsetting to get this diagnosis, yet very necessary," Anita says. Her mother has continued in the METS program for the past two and a half years. Here, Anita talks a bit about her experience:

What made you choose the METS program?

It was one of several programs recommended by the Hudson Valley Alzheimer's Association. METS seemed to have the most expertise.

What has the experience been like?

The testing was very rigorous, which made us certain we had the correct diagnosis. Dr. Pasquale Fonzetti [the director of the program] was very empathetic. The support staff was responsive and professional.

How do you feel your needs as a caregiver were addressed in the METS program?

It's very important to know that we are doing whatever we can to help Mom. Sadly, there is not much that can help dementia, but it is comforting to know that we have consulted with the best experts. As the caregiver, I am always able to reach someone to have prescriptions renewed promptly, or to answer questions regarding medications.

Would you recommend the program to others?

Yes, I would absolutely recommend it to others. We are very grateful and admiring of the mixture of clinical expertise and compassion at Burke.

Three Dementia Trials Currently Recruiting Participants

Burke is at the forefront of rehabilitation research and conducts clinical trials in a number of areas, including dementia and Alzheimer's disease research. These clinical trials can hopefully slow cognitive decline and/or treat associated symptoms. Burke actively seeks volunteers to take part in clinical trials, with eligibility based on pre-determined criteria.

Currently, Burke has three trials seeking participants:

- **Benfotiamine trial** for individuals with mild cognitive impairment or mild Alzheimer's disease dementia
- **TRIAD research study** for individuals with mild to severe agitation due to Alzheimer's disease
- **Cognite Trial** for individuals with early signs of memory loss or mild Alzheimer's disease

"*Benfotiamine, a derivative of Vitamin B1-Thiamine, targets the reduction of glucose metabolism. This is one of the earliest brain abnormalities seen in Alzheimer's disease. We are studying the potential benefits of the drug Benfotiamine in patients with Mild Cognitive Impairment or with mild dementia Alzheimer's.*"
